

**Parking By-Law**  
Special Town Meeting  
December 16, 1974  
Article 4

A provision allowing the Selectmen to prohibit parking on certain streets, according to and subject to the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 22, and further allowing the Selectmen to make rules and orders for the regulation of carriages and vehicles used within the Town limits with penalties for the violation thereof not exceeding twenty dollars. Also, further granting authority to the Selectmen, in accordance with and subject to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 22D, the power to confer authorization upon the chief officer of the police department or such sergeants and other officers of higher rank in the police department, as the chief may from time to time designate, to remove to some convenient place through the agency of a person or persons in the employ of the police department or by an independent contractor selected in accordance with the law on the basis of competitive bids, any vehicle parked or standing on any part of any way under the control of the Town in such a manner as to impede in any way the removal or plowing of snow or ice or in violation of any rule or regulation which prohibits the parking or standing of all vehicles on such way or portions thereof at such time and recite that whoever it shall be liable to charges for the removal and storage of the vehicles as well as being subject to punishment by fine. Liability may be imposed for the reasonable cost of such removal, and for the storage charges, if any, resulting there from, upon the owner of such vehicle. Vehicles owned by the Commonwealth or a political subdivision thereof or by the United States or by any instrumentality thereof or registered by a member of a foreign diplomatic corps or by a foreign consular officer who is not a citizen of the United States and bearing a distinctive number plate or otherwise conspicuously marked as so owned or registered, shall not, however, be subject to such removal.
